- **b. Plagiarism:** Using, by paraphrase or direct quotation, the published or unpublished work of another person without full and clear acknowledgment; using materials prepared by another person or agency engaged in the selling of term papers or other academic materials without prior authorization by the instructor; or engaging in other behavior that a reasonable person would consider plagiarism.
- c. Furnishing false information: Includes giving false information or false representations to any University official, instructor, or office. Submission of false information or withholding information at the time of admission or readmission may make an individual ineligible for admission to or continuation at the University.
